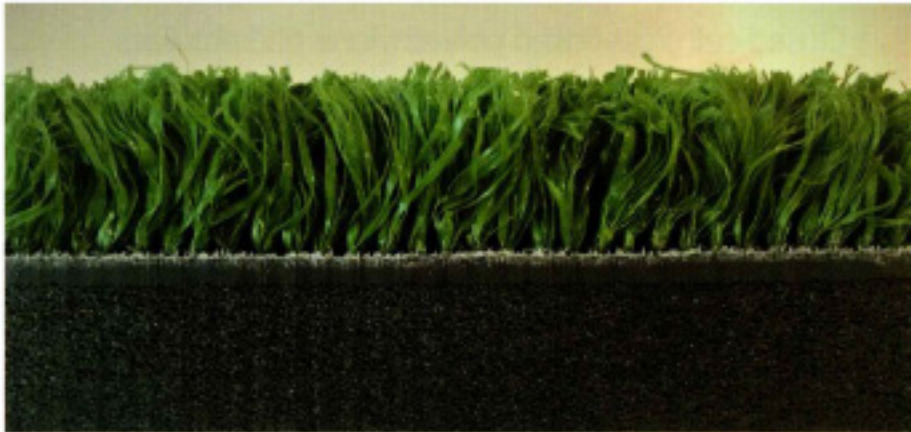

Avoiding common nylon is one of the many ways the Monster Mat™ stays newer, longer.

It also keeps the customer experience as exciting and rewarding as it can be...shot after shot, year after year.

So, while you're avoiding fading, crushing and delaminating, your players are enjoying consistent footing on a truly non-directional, supportive surface.

Commonly asked questions...

What makes the Monster Mat™ different? Most others use nylon, and we use a Z-pro LSR fiber. At -60°F or 160°F, the Monster Mat™ retains the same resiliency. During cold months, it doesn't get hard, and during warm months, it doesn't get soft. From the player's perspective, when hitting on a short pile nylon mat, you "skip" into the ball and can develop bad habits by cutting the ball. When hitting a "fat" shot, you can experience elbow shock and wrist shock. This is where picking the ball up to avoid the shock can develop different bad habits.

Why is the Monster Mat™ a good investment? During the time you have it working, more people will hit more balls on the Monster Mat, increasing your bottom line. Then, after 3 years, you can sell the used mats for up to \$100 to consumers or to another golf facility!

Where are your Monster Mats™ made? Our fiber and backing are made in the USA, and the finished product is assembled in the USA by SafePlay Golf. Many brands are made in China, Canada, and Europe and simply distributed in the U.S. Many mats are made with cheap fiber from China, and are not effectively UV stabilized.

Does the green residue come off and on to the club face? No. Our Z-pro LSR fiber does not transfer the green residue to the club face like the nylon fiber can.

Will the mats absorb water? No. Our closed cell, cross-linked polyethylene pad and Z-pro LSR fiber will not absorb measurable amounts of water or support bacterial growth like nylon mats do.

What is the maintenance involved with the Monster Mats™? Rotate the mat ¼ turn weekly so that the mat receives even wear. Also, once every 6 months (or before storage), stand the mat up and power wash from 18" away to remove all loose debris and dirt. This will help to prolong the life of the mat.

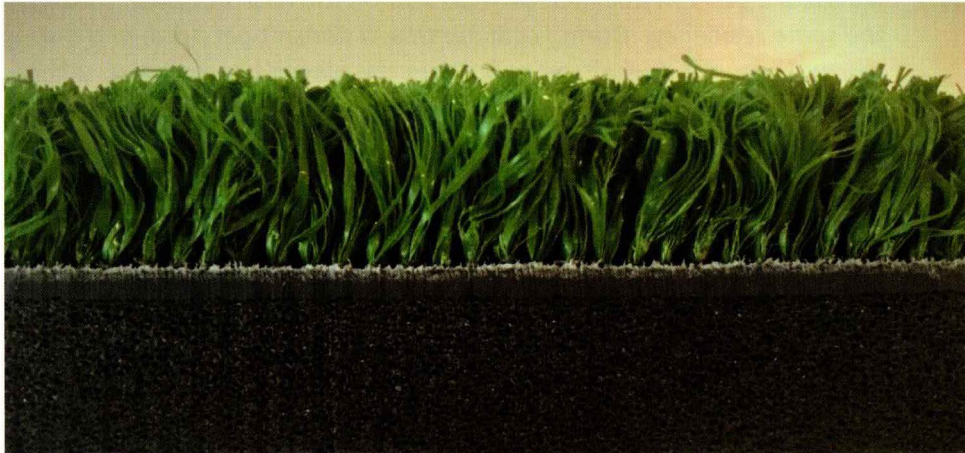
Can you stick a tee anywhere on it? No. This will rupture the backing, shortening the life of the mat.

Why are the Monster Mats better to hit from than a bristle brush mat? Bristle brush has no resemblance to natural grass. They are good for exercise, but bad for golf.
